

Central Michigan University's Graduate Medical Education program (CMU Medical Education Partners) experienced another exceptional academic year. In June 2024, 41 residents, the organization's largest graduating class, took the next step in their promising medical careers. We are proud of the fact that 50% of the graduating residents stayed in Michigan and 40% stayed in the Great Lakes Bay Region. This will only improve with the strategies that are being implemented.

Out of the 41 graduates from last year, 12 left the region to obtain fellowships (advanced medical education specialty training) that is not offered in our region. We are about to change that! The strongest academic programs nationally offer fellowships.

Fellowships serve several purposes:

- 1. Enhance the underlying core residency (internal medicine)
- 2. Create additional educators for students and residents
- 3. Create additional board-certified physicians that can take care of patients while they train as specialists
- 4. Create a pipeline of specialists for the region

The CMEP Board has approved the establishment of a Critical Care fellowship set to begin in July 2026. Following this, a Cardiology fellowship will be introduced, along with a third specialty area that will be determined later. This initiative represents a significant growth opportunity for CMU College of Medicine and CMEP, while also benefiting our health system partners: Covenant HealthCare and MyMichigan Medical Center Saginaw.







Moreover, we are dedicated to making a positive impact on our community and patients every day. Our Women and Children's Center is actively working to reduce infant mortality in Saginaw County. The infant mortality rate here is similar to that of Detroit and ranks among the highest in Michigan. Notably, 50% of these infant deaths are linked to unsafe sleep practices. In response, our organization has embraced a collaborative effort and formed a coalition with Covenant HealthCare, CMU, BWell Saginaw, Saginaw County Health Department, and Perinatal Quality Collaborative. Together, we aim to educate every resident in our community and make a meaningful difference. True to our mission, we are advancing the quality of care for our communities while educating individuals to become exceptional physicians and supporting the staffing needs of our region. The pages of this report describe our impact over the past year. We thank you for your interest and support and invite you to learn more about our programs as we advance our vision to become nationally


recognized for our innovative learner programs, a clinical leader in the region, and vital to our hospital and academic partners, medical staff, and patient communities.



GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION



CMU Medical Education Partners (CMEP) and its three corporate members - Central Michigan University and teaching hospitals, Covenant HealthCare and MyMichigan Health Saginaw, uphold a long-lived tradition of serving patients, while educating learners as a part of a premier academic medical center.

Through collaborative efforts with the CMU College of Medicine, CMU Medical Education Partners is responsible for eight residencies and one fellowship. As of June 2024, it was home to 173 resident and fellow learners, and 78 faculty providers.

The primary function of the CMU Medical Education Partners and the GME department, specifically, is to ensure accreditation for the residency and fellowship programs. Each program is fully accredited by the Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical Educations (ACGME). Podiatry is fully accredited by the Council of Podiatric Medical Education (CPME).

The commitment of CMU Health to establish a physician pipeline in the Great Lakes Bay region is one of the key reasons why leaders embarked on an initiative to introduce a 10-year vision to integrate the CMU College of Medicine with CMU Medical Education Partners to form one CMU Health.

The *Medical Diamond*, a revitalization project, is a milestone that has been made possible through thousands of hours of hard work from dedicated employees and leaders across the community.

As of December 2023, Central Michigan University Board of Trustees approved a resolution to support the fundraising process for a four-year medical school along the Saginaw Riverfront.

This development will ensure a brighter future for training future physicians, promote economic prosperity in the region, and improve access to care for patients with the collaboration of our teaching hospitals Covenant HealthCare and MyMichigan Health Saginaw.

OBSTETRICS & GYNECOLOGY

Our OB/GYN clinic recorded a total of 13,489 patient visits.



CMU Health's Obstetrics and Gynecology department is centered in our Women and Children's Center on Houghton Avenue.

Dr. Christina Andreozzi and Dr. Alexa Shepherd continue to provide a range of urogynecologic and pelvic support procedures, both in-office and in the operating room. Dr. Veronika Kinaschuk and Dr. Rachel Rezmer offer advanced laparoscopic and robotic approaches to surgery.

After three years of dedicated effort, we celebrated the remarkable transformation of our CMU Health Women and Children's Center at the **Covenant Children's Hospital. The reconstructed** space enhances our Department of Obstetrics and **Gynecology and our Department of Pediatrics.**

These improvements enhance our educational programs and patient experience.



This evidence-based program helps mothers and families spend more time with their health care providers, engage in group discussions, and learn about nutrition, stress management, breastfeeding, and labor and delivery.

This dynamic prenatal care model enhances maternal and infant health outcomes while reducing racial disparities.

Thanks to the generous support of our community partners, CenteringPregnancy® has received over \$400,000 to expand access to care.

We continue to collaborate with several community partners, including the CAN Council, Maternal Infant Health Program, WIC, Saginaw County Health Department, Keys of Hope, and local doulas in the Great Lakes Bay Region.

From birth through teenage years, our pediatric team at CMU Health is right there every step of the way. Our provider team welcomed Thomas Schomaker, DO, as clerkship director and Anisa Bookmyer, Nurse Practitioner who practices in our pediatrics and family medicine department.

Our Pediatric Residency program welcomed four residents, bringing the two-year complement to eight. The program now includes the addition of a pediatric simulation elective as well as Child and Adolescent Psychiatry elective for third-year learners.

CMU Emergency Medicine welcomed nine new first year residents to the Class of 2027, including our first emergency medicine resident in the *Michigan Doctors Improving Access to Care* (MIDOCs) program. MIDOCs is a state-funded program built to recruit and retain physicians in underserved areas in the state of Michigan. Following the state's approval to include emergency medicine in 2023, our residency program is the first to participate in MIDOCs.

CMU Emergency Medicine residency

With a total of 29 residents in training, our program was once again selected as one of two training sites in Michigan to host the American Board of Emergency Medicine's Dr. Leon. L. Haley Jr. Bridge to the Future of Emergency Medicine Academy. Additionally, the EM program hosted an annual Basic Ultrasound Course for all the incoming first-year residents in our CMU Health residency programs with over 40 attendees.



As families turn to more convenient options for care, CMU Health's Family Medicine department has expanded its clinic to offer same-day appointments. This initiative allows us to better serve patients at our Concentric location, providing immediate access to care that reduces long waiting times and helps patients avoid emergency room visits.

Dr. Taylor Gaudard established an evidence-based lactation consulting clinic to assist mothers and babies experiencing lactation difficulties. Additionally, with the introduction of our new geriatrician, Dr. Saad Chaudhry, we have enhanced our geriatric services at the Colony (primary care) location.

Furthermore, our program welcomed nine new residents, bringing the total number of learners to 25.

Our faculty is now Point of Care Ultrasound (POCUS) trained, which brings ultrasound services in an office visit helping to eliminate emergency room visits and external urgent care visits.

Specialized Physicians Provide Care for Individuals of **All Ages**



An in-house geriatrics specialty clinic has been established with the addition of Dr. Saad Chaudhry. Dr. Chaudhry has been instrumental in providing patient care to both the inpatient and outpatient geriatric population, which is an important rotation for our learners. His exceptional contributions earned him the Outpatient Clinical Teaching Award. Additionally, we proudly welcomed Dr. Yuri Kim, a graduate of our IM program, to our faculty in July 2024.

Dr. Xia Wang, board-certified medical geneticist, has experienced tremendous growth in patient encounters, seeing a 200% increase. Likewise, Rheumatologist Dr. Jonathan Rene has achieved more than a **20% increase** in encounters at our CMU Health Women and Children's Center. In the next academic year, we are set to introduce a new infectious disease specialist to work alongside Dr. Nicholas Haddad, as well as our first Internal Medicine hospitalist caring for patients at Covenant HealthCare, who is also a past graduate of our program.

The Internal Medicine Residency program, housed principally at MyMichigan Saginaw, has grown to 35 residents. Thanks to a program expansion, our inpatient IM academic team at Covenant HealthCare, under the leadership of Assistant Program Director and Covenant Site Director Dr. Paritharsh Ghantasala, has also become an important part of the internal medicine training.

This year, graduates have excelled in their fellowship matches, continuing our tradition of success. One graduate secured a position in Endocrinology at the Cleveland Clinic, while two matched in Cardiology at the University of West Virginia and Michigan State University/McLaren Lansing. Lastly, but importantly, all CMU graduates passed the ABIM board exam, with three graduates who did not enter specialty training choosing to continue their medical careers right here in the Great Lakes Bay region.






GENERAL SURGERY

In June 2024, we welcomed four talented new interns who are thriving within our program. Additionally, we proudly graduated three chief residents who have advanced to fellowships in cardiothoracic surgery at the University of Miami and colorectal surgery at both Adventist Health in Orlando and the Cleveland Clinic. The hard work of our residents and faculty has resulted in 23 manuscript publications this year, underscoring our dedication to research and inquiry. We are steadfast in our mission to foster a supportive and inclusive environment for all.


Our general surgery department has seen remarkable growth this year, highlighting our commitment to excellence in patient care.

Clinical activity remains impressive, with nearly 10,000 patient visits and over 1,800 surgeries scheduled.

Additionally, Dr. Christina Maser was promoted to program director in February 2024. We also eagerly await the addition of three new faculty members in September 2024, which will enhance our educational and clinical offerings.

PSYCHIATRY

Podiatry Residency **Essential for** Maintaining **Patient Health**



In the 2023 - 2024 academic year, the podiatry residency was approved to expand the program to three residents beginning in 2024-2025. This significant enhancement enriches our learning environment, as well as foster great collaboration among residents, attending physicians and support staff. We can continue to deliver personalized mentorship and comprehensive training, effectively responding to the increased demand for proficient podiatric surgeons.

Our program's hallmark is its extensive hands-on surgical training, which is essential for developing

skilled practitioners. Our residents successfully completed over 2,000 surgical cases across a range of specialties, including forefoot and rearfoot surgery, reconstructive procedures, diabetic limb salvage, and trauma care. This impressive achievement is a testament to the program's robust training opportunities and the surging demand for quality podiatric care.

Improving Mental Wellness for Our Patients

CMU Health's cutting edge Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS) therapy, which is used for medication resistant depression, initiated in June 2024, thanks to the generous support of the William McNally Foundation, Frank N. Andersen Foundation, Wickson-Link, Nickless, and Turner Foundations. This technological breakthrough therapy is supervised by Drs. Kai Anderson, Mohammad Jafferany, Mindy Prows and Dianne Plath.

Additionally, Dr. Jafferany also runs a psychodermatology clinic and patients providing a wide range of clinical experiences for our residents to benefit from.

27% increase in total psychiatry patient visits Our psychiatry residency welcomed eight new residents, bringing the total number to 32. Drs. Alexander Bejna and Mindy Prows have played a vital role in supervising the collaborative care clinics, particularly in pediatrics and primary care. Learners also have the advantage of training in our Simulation Lab, which adds an extra layer of realism to medical education.

This state-of-the art technology is equipped with a virtual operating room, obstetrics, intensive care unit, emergency department and pediatric environments for training in a variety of situations.


The center has been actively engaged in diverse initiatives, reflecting its dedication to education, innovation and community engagement.


Maintaining Our Financial Health

As one of the premier nonprofit health care organizations in the region that serves a high percentage of Medicaid and underinsured patients, it is essential for us to manage our financial resources. This allows us to effectively meet the needs of our patients and the community.

In fiscal year 2023, we had a very successful year, achieving a net income of \$1,041,052. However, in fiscal year 2024, we faced significant challenges due to a decreased hospital census resulting from staffing shortages that were a consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic. This led to a reduction of \$2,460,780 in our Graduate Medical Education funding compared to the previous year.

Despite this decrease, the actual number of resident Full-Time Equivalents (FTEs) increased due to the Board-approved and planned expansion. Unfortunately, these circumstances resulted in an operating loss of \$1,660,214.

Celebrating the Graduation of 1,000 Residents

A key achievement of our work this year is that 41 physicians have successfully completed their residency and fellowship programs.

This year's graduation ceremony was a landmark event for Graduate Medical Education (GME) in our region, as we proudly celebrated the graduation of our 1,000th resident. CMEP's journey began in 1947 with the establishment of the first residency program in Saginaw, which focused on providing essential clinical obstetrics training.

Since that time, we have significantly expanded our offerings to accommodate nearly 180 residents across eight accredited residency programs, demonstrating our commitment to excellence in medical education.




